



Attendee Code of Conduct & Policies

The Menopause Society's Attendee Code of Conduct establishes clear expectations for our members, nonmembers, exhibitors, vendors, staff, and other participants, helping to maintain professionalism, respect, and efficiency. It ensures that all attendees can contribute effectively, prevents disruptions, and fosters a positive and productive environment.

Key Principles

- All attendees must conduct themselves in a professional and respectful manner, free from discrimination, harassment, or intimidation.
- Inappropriate conduct such as harassment, threatening or unwelcome physical or verbal actions, or disruptive behavior such as protesting is not tolerated.
- If you experience inappropriate behavior or witness it, please contact a staff member or a Board member of The Menopause Society immediately.

Violations

- Those who violate the Attendee Code of Conduct may be temporarily or permanently prohibited from attending future meetings, conferences, educational programs, or other events hosted by The Menopause Society.
- Those who engage in false certification of attendance, facilitate false certification of attendance, or gain unauthorized access to meetings, events, or educational content may be banned from participating in future activities offered by The Menopause Society.

Meeting Policies

- Name badges must be worn at all times and are nontransferable. Badges are required for admission to meeting and session rooms and all official events.
- Unauthorized access or assisting others to gain entry to meeting events is grounds for immediate removal.
- Cell phones should be silenced to avoid disrupting other attendees and presenters. Please do not take phone calls during presentations.
- No photography is permitted in the meeting and session rooms, Exhibit Hall, or Poster Hall except as authorized by The Menopause Society.
- Children younger than 18 (except with nursing mothers) are not permitted in meeting or session rooms, Exhibit Hall, or Poster Hall.
- For safety reasons, strollers are not permitted.
- If a room is full, entry may be denied in order to comply with fire marshal guidelines.
